4 Nights / 5 Days

### DAY-01: ( GUWAHATI TO KAZIRANGA )



Welcome on arrival at Guwahati Airport / Station and transfer to Kaziranga (250Kms / 5hrs). Kaziranga was declared a National Park in 1974 and UNESCO declared Kaziranga a World Heritage Site in 1985. The park hosts two thirds of the world population of Rhinos.

#### DAY-02: ( KAZIRANGA JUNGLE SAFARI )

Embark on an Elephant safari ride in the park early in the moring. (Elephant riding time: 1st Ride- 5.15-6.15 AM; 2nd ride: 6.30-7.30 am). Apart from the Rhino, other species found are hog deer, swamp deer, wild buffalo, elephants and if you are lucky, the magnificent and elusive tiger. It is virtually a paradise for bird watchers, with a variety of migratory and resident birds. It is also home to pelicans, storks and darters as there are a number of water bodies inside the Park.

After breakfast at the hotel you can visit tea plantations and rubber plantations. In the afternoon enjoy a Jeep safari in the Central Range. Kaziranga is a vast expanse of tall elephant grass, marshland, and dense tropical moist broadleaf forests, crisscrossed by four major rivers, including the Brahmaputra, and the park includes numerous small bodies of water. Stay overnight at Kaziranga.

## DAY-03: ( KAZIRANGA TO GUWAHATI )

Enjoy your breakfast and check out for your transfer to Guwahati. Situated on the South Bank of river Brahmaputra this is the largest city of Assam, a major riverine port city and one of the fastest growing cities in India. Many ancient Hindu temples are in the city, giving it the name "City of Temples" the most important being Kamakhya Temple. Spend your evening at leisure and stay overnight in Guwahati.

### DAY-04: GUWAHATI LOCAL SIGHTSEEING (08 HRS / 80KMS)

Start a the full day sightseeing tour in and around this capital city of Assam, starting with the Kamakhya Temple. Situated on top of the Nilachal Hill, Maa Kamakhya Temple is the most sacred among the tantrik shrines of Shakti worship in the world. Next cover Balaji Temple, State Museum and Navagraha Temple, which is dedicated to the nine planets located on the top of Chitrasal Hill. Continue with Umananda Temple on Bhasmachal, which is a Shiva temple located at the Peacock Island (the smallest inhabited riverine island in the world), Sankardeva Kalakhetra, which is a cultural institution in the Panjabari area, named after the medieval poet-playwright and reformer Srimanta Sankardev. In the evening experience the river cruise from Jahajghat or Mackhowa to Jahajghat or Mackhowa on the river Brahmaputra. Stay overnight at Guwahati.

# DAY-05 DEPARTURE

The next morning, departure transfer to Guwahati Airport / Station.
