India's wild landscapes are as diverse as its cultures, and at the heart of this wilderness roam the mighty big cats-symbols of power, mystery, and survival. From dense forests and open grasslands to icy mountain ranges, India offers one of the most incredible opportunities on the planet to observe big cats in their natural habitats.



The Striped Royalty of India

The Bengal tiger, a global icon of strength and beauty, holds center stage in Indian wildlife. Perhaps the most famous sighting grounds are in Jim Corbett National Park in Uttarakhand-the first national park in India and a part of the Project Tiger initiative. In Ranthambhore (Rajasthan), tigers stroll past ancient ruins, while Bandhavgarh, Kanha, and Pench in Madhya Pradesh provide some of the most reliable tiger sightings due to high densities and accessible terrain. In southern India, Nagarhole and Bandipur are equally thrilling, where the forest often echoes with alarm calls-hinting at a tiger's approach.

The Asiatic Pride of Gir

The Asiatic lion-once spread from the Mediterranean to India-now survives only in Gir Forest National Park, Gujarat. Smaller than their African cousins but no less regal, these lions are a symbol of resilience and conservation success. Gir's dry forests and open scrublands offer a unique setting to observe the only wild population of Asiatic lions left on Earth.



The Masters of Stealth

India's leopards are widespread, yet rarely seen-true masters of camouflage and stealth. However, certain regions offer excellent chances to spot them, including Jhalana Leopard Reserve and Bera

in Rajasthan, where leopards often coexist with human settlements. In the south, the forests of Kabini, Wayanad, and the Western Ghats shelter both regular leopards and the rare, striking black panthers.

Ghosts of the Himalayas

High above the tree line in Ladakh, Spiti Valley, and parts of Uttarakhand, the elusive snow leopard silently stalks its prey across snow-covered ridges. Known as the "ghost of the mountains," it is perhaps the most challenging big cat to spot, but also the most rewarding. Hemis National Park is a hotspot for those willing to brave the cold and altitude in hopes of a glimpse.



Beyond the Big Cats

While big cats steal the spotlight, India's wild places offer much more. In Kaziranga National Park, one-horned rhinoceroses graze peacefully. Elephants roam in herds in southern and northeastern reserves. Sloth bears, Indian bison, and a stunning variety of birds complete the experience. Every Indian jungle has its own rhythm-where drama, survival, and beauty unfold every day.

'Big Cats' celebrates not only the majesty of India's feline predators but also the rich, interconnected ecosystems they rule. Its architecture follows the land's natural contours, retaining dense tree cover and ensuring minimal footprint (12-17%). No trees were cut in construction, honoring the orchard's integrity through the lens of Traditional Ecological Knowledge (TEK).

Local culture deeply influenced the design. Materials like Bela stone, lime plaster for natural cooling, and handcrafted bamboo and reclaimed wood furniture elevate both sustainability and aesthetic value. Over 32 local artisans collaborated to integrate terracotta, macramé, and handcrafted decor, creating a distinct sense of place. Expansive windows, open spaces, and fluid transitions between indoors and outdoors promote natural light, ventilation, and circadian balance-hallmarks of biophilic design.

Chasing Shadows:

A Wildlife Expedition Through Ladakh's Frozen Frontiers

If there's one place that truly humbles you, it's Ladakh in winter. Wind-swept, stark, and eerily silent, it's also where the wildest creatures walk unseen. Over the past few seasons, I've been leading wildlife expeditions across this high-altitude desert, hoping-always hoping-to catch a glimpse of Ladakh's most elusive residents.

Our journey started in Bilupa Mountain Lodge, Chushot, just outside Leh. Tuchik in upper Chushot area, It's a lesser-known snow leopard habitat, quieter than the popular spots, which makes it perfect for intimate tracking experiences. With help from sharp-eyed local spotters, we trailed a female leopard and her cub for three breathless days. One morning, we found fresh tracks in the snow winding toward the cliffs-and then, as if by magic, she appeared, surveying the valley like a queen. Next, we headed to Matho, home to dramatic terrain and ancient monasteries perched above steep gorges. Here, sightings are harder-earned. We camped for hours in the biting wind, scanning the ridgelines. Just when we thought we'd struck out, she emerged at sunset-elegant, confident, and utterly wild. Uley was our next base. It's a hotspot for snow leopards and one of my favourite spots in Ladakh. We stayed at Snow Leopard Lodge, a cosy, family-run homestay that combines warm hospitality with deep conservation roots. Mornings were filled with stories, scope setups, and butter tea, and evenings often brought sightings across the valley-silent, powerful moments under a frozen sky.





But it wasn't just about snow leopards.

In Sakti village, I had my first brush with a lynx-a rare and magical encounter. We followed faint tracks through juniper-dotted slopes, and just before dusk, there it was: a sleek shadow moving silently through the scrub, vanishing almost as soon as it appeared.

Then Summers, there was Hanle, far in the southeast, near the Changthang plateau. It's a place that feels like the edge of the world. Here, amidst the flatlands and endless skies, we found the grumpiest little predator of them all: the Pallas's cat. Furry, wide-eyed, and wonderfully weird, it peeked out from behind a rock, gave us a look of utter disdain, and disappeared.

Wildlife tracking in Ladakh is not easy. The cold bites, the altitude tests you, and the animals don't always show up. But when they do, it changes you. It teaches patience, respect, and a kind of reverence for the wild that's hard to shake. If you're planning a trip, opt for Bilupa Mountain Lodge in Chushot, Matho, Sakti, and Hanle all have wonderful options that support conservation and give you a true taste of Ladakhi life.

This isn't just a trip-it's a connection. To the land. To the people. And to the wild things that still roam free.
